Pack Black Furies

This is a response from a pack of **Black Furies** in *Werewolf: The Apocalypse*, comprising five different Auspices: Ragabash (Crescent Moon/Trickster), Theurge (Gibbous Moon/Seer), Philodox (Half Moon/Judge), Galliard (Full Moon/Bard), and Ahroun (New Moon/Warrior). As Black Furies, the primary motivations of **feminine empowerment** and **protecting the wild** will influence all their answers, but each Auspice will bring a unique perspective to the table.
