Pack Silent Striders

This is an interesting thought experiment! As a pack of **Silent Striders**, known for their wanderings, wisdom, connection to the spirit world, and deep distrust of the Wyrms (corruption), their answers would reflect their individual Auspices (role/nature) while being filtered through their tribal background.

Here is the combined response from the pack: a **Ragabash** (Trickster), a **Theurge** (Mystic), a **Philodox** (Judge), a **Galliard** (Bard), and an **Ahroun** (Warrior). The majority or most compelling pack perspective is used for each answer.

? The Silent Strider Pack's Questionnaire

Question	Silent Strider Pack Perspective	Rationale
What motivates you most?	Wisdom and understanding (via Theurge and Philodox)	Theurge and Ragabash seek hidden knowledge and the Philodox seeks truth, while the tribe as a whole values lore. Justice and fairness is a close second for the Philodox.
How do you view technology?	A tool to adapt and survive (via Ragabash and Galliard)	Silent Striders must adapt to modern travel and city life to hunt the Wyrms and find lost lore. They are not Luddites, but wary.
Your ideal community would be:	Spiritual and seeking enlightenment (via Theurge)	Striders value the Umbra (spirit world) and mystical understanding above rigid hierarchy or mere loyalty, though all are important.
When faced with conflict, you prefer to:	Listen to elders and tradition (via Philodox)	The Philodox seeks balanced judgment, while the tribe's history emphasizes lessons learned over direct confrontation or blind manipulation.

Question	Silent Strider Pack Perspective	Rationale
How do you feel about rules and tradition?	Adapt them to new times (via Ragabash/Galliard)	As a traveling tribe, Striders can't hold to rigid traditions like a settled pack. They carry core values but must apply them to a constantly changing world.
A corrupt official endangers the city. You:	Work from the shadows, sabotage their plans (via Ragabash)	The Ragabash naturally prefers discreet, surgical disruption and sabotage, which aligns well with the Striders' non-direct, wandering nature.
You encounter a helpless animal suffering. You:	Call upon spirits for guidance (via Theurge)	The Theurge, through their connection to the Umbra, would seek spiritual guidance or a Banishment rite, which is the most "Silent Strider" response.
Your group is divided on a decision. You:	Listen, mediate, and suggest options (via Philodox)	This is the primary role of the Philodox (Judge) and ensures the group acts cohesively and fairly, preventing a split which would hamper the tribe's primary mission.
A stranger requests refuge. You:	Approach cautiously, consult with peers (via Philodox/Ahroun)	Striders are cautious due to their history of betrayal and exile. They won't refuse, but they will be watchful and use the Pack's wisdom (Philodox/Theurge) before committing.
You witness injustice. You:	Gather allies and act as a group (via Galliard/Ahroun)	While the Ahroun would want to step in, the Galliard's ability to rally others and the Philodox's sense of group integrity means they will coordinate for maximum impact.
Which resonates with you?	Mystical exploration of spiritual realms (via Theurge)	As the pack is a Silent Strider pack, their deepest resonance is with the Umbra and the mysteries it holds, vital for finding lost lore and hunting the Wyrms.
For you, leadership should be:	Earned through respect (via Ahroun/Philodox)	Leadership in the pack is functional. The Ahroun leads in a fight, the Theurge in the Umbra, but overall authority is granted based on competence and the respect it earns.
How do you treat secrets?	Protect and use strategically (via Ragabash)	Secrets are often necessary to survive on the road and against cunning enemies. The Ragabash is best suited to guard and deploy them when the time is right.

Question	Silent Strider Pack Perspective	Rationale
How do you view modern human society?	Flawed but redeemable (via Philodox/Galliard)	The Galliard sees stories of potential and the Philodox sees a balance that <i>can</i> be restored. They need humanity to survive, so a complete dismissal isn't viable.
If given supernatural power, you'd:	Unravel ancient mysteries (via Theurge)	The core Silent Strider mission is to rediscover the forgotten lore and history of Gaia, a task perfectly suited for the Theurge and aligned with the tribe's greatest need.
