? My Motivation and Beliefs

What motivates you most?

- **Listen, mediate, and suggest options** (The Ragabash often sits outside the main conflict, observing the dynamics. My new perspective can sometimes reveal a unifying path or alternative solution.)

A stranger requests refuge. You:

- **Approach cautiously, consult with peers** (The Furies are protective of their sacred spaces. Hospitality is a virtue, but security is paramount. A Ragabash must gather information before a decision is made.)

You witness injustice. You:

- **Gather allies and act as a group** (Injustice requires strength to overcome, and though I am strong, a coordinated pack is often the only way to ensure success and safety.)

Which resonates with you?
